Professor Dingyuan Du is the Chief Surgeon & Professor of Surgery and serves as the Director of Chongqing Trauma Medical Center, the Director of Chongqing University Trauma Medical Center, the Executive Director of China National Regional Center for Trauma Medicine, and Member of the Expert Group for the Certification of China National and Regional center for Trauma Medicine. He serves as the leader of academic technology in Chongqing, and the "Innovation Leader" of Chongqing, a modern megacity of 32 million people.

Professor Du also serves in many other national committees and organizations, including Vice President of Committee on Trauma of the Chinese Medical Association, the Vice Chairman of China Trauma Rescue & Treatment Association, the Chairman of Chongqing Trauma Rescue & Treatment Association, the Deputy

Chief Editor of the Chinese Journal of Trauma, the Deputy Chief Editor of Trauma Surgery, and sits on the editorial boards of numerous journals. He co-edited two trauma textbooks.

Professor Du is a national leader in the field of trauma in China and plays a major role in the establishment of China's national trauma care system.

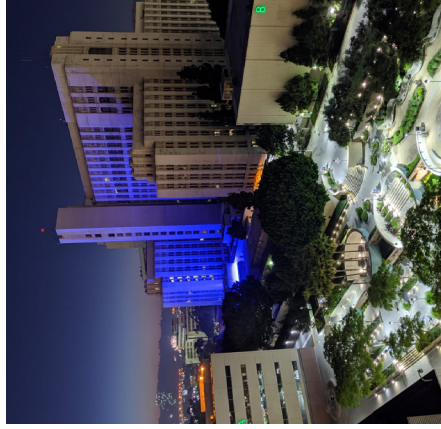
