### COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course offers a review of important and timely topics in the field of perinatal medicine. Based on a review of the literature, input from our own expert faculty, and analyses from past conferences, we are proud to offer a comprehensive program with topics including: evidence-based guidelines and standardized safety principles for managing placenta previa; disparities in maternal health; fetal growth restriction; effective management of labor induction; cost effectiveness analyses and their impact on advocacy. In addition, evidence is examined to set a practical, clinical approach to cardiovascular disease in pregnancy and preeclampsia. Valuable insights are provided into various hypertensive conditions in pregnancy and postpartum. Lectures by faculty from the Keck School of Medicine of USC and distinguished guest faculty from Oregon Health and Science University and the University of Tennessee will outline controversies, discuss recent developments, and suggest recommendations. Participants have direct access to the speakers and ample opportunity for intensive question and answer post-lecture discussions.

### **TARGET AUDIENCE**

The program was developed for gynecologists, obstetricians, perinatologists, neonatologists, nurses, nurse midwives and other allied health professionals. It is USC's mission for this educational opportunity to provide participants with objective, evidence-based clinical content, to incorporate into their practices, improve clinical care, and further the well-being of their patients.

### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- · Assess current literature regarding the management of preeclampsia.
- Formulate a practical plan to manage fetal heart rate abnormalities.
- Describe and incorporate a treatment plan for labor induction.
- · Apply practical tips to thoroughly assess and manage placenta previa.
- Describe a practical approach to work-up of hypertension in pregnancy.
- Assess the controversies surrounding maternal mortality.
- · Construct a practical algorithm for the management of disparities in healthcare.
- Describe the risks and treatment strategies for lower cesarean section rates.
- Describe strategies to recognize and treat infectious diseases in pregnancy.
- Explore the work-up and management of endocrine emergencies in pregnancy.


