- COURSE DESCRIPTION

The diagnosis and treatment of gastrointestinal and liver diseases have rapidly evolved, significantly altering patient care approaches. New pharmacological developments have revolutionized the management of Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis, and viral hepatitis. Additionally, advancements in endoscopic and imaging techniques have reshaped our diagnostic and therapeutic strategies for pancreaticobiliary diseases, motility disorders, and early luminal neoplasia. These changes have created a knowledge gap in current patient treatment methodologies. This conference aims to update community standards of practice, covering cancer screening guidelines, obesity management, and various topics in luminal, pancreatic, and liver diseases. It emphasizes the latest advancements in Gastroenterology and Hepatology, which hold the potential to enhance patient care.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Explain the role of supportive techniques in the evaluation of esophageal disorders and how best to evaluate belching, bloating, distention, and other common GI symptoms.
- Review updates in the medical management of IBD and the management of dysplasia.
- Outline the newest screening and surveillance approaches for colorectal and pancreatic cancer.
- Describe the role of capsule endoscopy and deep endoscopy in the evaluation of the small bowel.
- Identify advances in third-space endoscopy and complicated biliary cases.
- Describe the evaluation process for both living liver donors and recipients, encompassing medical, surgical, and patient perspectives.
- Recognize the pathophysiology and clinical implications of acute kidney injury in cirrhosis, including its impact on patient prognosis and management strategies.
- Review the latest advancements in treatments for hepatocellular carcinoma (HCC), including surgical, locoregional, and systemic therapies.
- Describe methods to optimize the care of the amulatory patient with cirrhosis and prevent decompensation.
- Discover insights into recent advances in managing metabolic dysfunction associated with steatohepatitis (MASH), including pharmacological and lifestyle interventions.
- Examine the latest developments in hepatitis B treatment, including antiviral therapies.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is intended for local and regional community gastroenterologists, hepatologists, general surgeons, medical oncologists, and allied health professionals who seek to enhance their understanding of the diagnosis and management of GI and Liver Disease. The geographical target emphasizes local and regional gastroenterologists in community practices within referral range to Keck Medical Center including Los Angeles County, Orange County, and neighboring states.
