COURSE DESCRIPTION

The last few years have seen tremendous advances in the management of gastrointestinal and liver diseases. New medical therapies, personalized medicine, genetically-based treatments, and technological advances are changing how we diagnose and treat our patients. The rapid changes in medical therapies, drug delivery, and endoscopic interventions has led to a knowledge gap in how we now approach and treat many of our patients with gastrointestinal and liver diseases. As a result, guidelines recommending best management practices continue to evolve. The conference focuses on the obesity epidemic and how it impacts the daily practice of gastroenterology and liver disease, and provides updated cancer screening deadlines. The purpose of this conference is to bring the latest advances in these new diagnostic and therapeutics to the health care providers who work in community practice.
