- Outline the fundamental principles of street medicine and how they are used to engage patients.
- Discuss Alternative Clinical Guidelines for the Street and how to integrate into practice.
- Examine potiential risk management and compliance issues in street medicine.
- Design and implement a quality assurance program in the context of street medicine.



COURSE DESCRIPTION

The LA Street Medicine Symposium is an essential step to develop a workforce ready to meet the needs of our neighbors living on the street. This event establishes a high-visibility project that builds a multidisciplinary pipeline and aligns with the Keck School of Medicine (KSOM) stragetic plan by "pushing boundaries of discovery in new and uexpected ways," in clinical care. The symposium supports the KSOM initiative to promote social justice, and serves to strengthen collaboration with the community and outreach efforts by promoting programs and services that meet local needs.

This symposium grounds attendees in the fundamental principles of street medicine and teach best practices through presentations

from street medicine leaders in Los Angeles and nationwide. Issues regarding risk management, compliance, and quality assurance will prepare attendees to deliver high quality, safe care on the street.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is intended for current and aspirational homeless service providers including physicians, Advanced Practice Providers, nurses, counselors, therapists and social workers.
