### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

LA County is home to over 40,000 neighbors sleeping on our streets and under our bridges. Street medicine addresses the unique needs of the unsheltered homeless by delivering care directly to them in their own environment. The LA Street Medicine Symposium is one of only two street medicine focused conferences available in the US making this a unique opportunity to connect, learn and innovate together. This event provides an opportunity for street medicine teams, people with lived expertise in homelessness, community members, health plans, community organizations, government representatives and academic medicine to come together in a common space to discuss the current state of street medicine in California, street medicine best practices and where street medicine should go next. This day will be highlighted by two internationally recognized experts in homelessness as our keynote speakers, innovative lectures, and an interactive problem-solving workshop to promote new ideas and new partnerships.

### **EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES**

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Discuss the complexities of health care delivery, policy and access for people experiencing homelessness.
- Identify new, innovative ways to advocate for the unhoused population through networking, storytelling and policy change.
- Discern how to apply evidence-based medicine to the street environment.
