COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course aims to provide an update on colorectal surgery topics, with a focus on new technology, updated management strategies and education on advanced surgical techniques. The program is a one-and-a-half-day event with didactic lectures, panel discussions, and Q&A sessions with participants. The following colorectal surgery topics will be covered: minimally invasive surgery, colorectal cancer, inflammatory bowel disease, anorectal disorders and other benign colorectal diseases. Participants will leave with a broad understanding of these disease processes and how to treat them in day to day practice.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Describe management techniques and pre-malignant colorectal conditions.
- Integrate current management guidelines and operative indications into practice for benign colorectal conditions such as hemorrhoids, IBD, fistula and diverticulitis.
- Distinguish new minimally invasive techniques and outline their role in management of colorectal conditions.
- Discuss quality metrics for various colorectal conditions including IBD, rectal cancer, and identify future trends in assessment standards.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is intended for practicing general and colorectal surgeons, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, endoscopy nurses involved in the care of patients with colorectal diseases.
